2025 Legislative Session – February Update

As reported last month, the Oregon Legislature has convened for a legislative session expected to last until June. They are developing the budget for the 25-27 biennium and considering policy issues like transportation funding, wildfire funding and prevention, affordable housing, and more. This memo provides an update on legislative activities relating to the Lottery.

Committee Considers Prohibiting the Sale or Purchase of Winning Lottery Tickets

On January 30, the House Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection held a public hearing on <u>HB 3115</u>, which would prohibit the sale or purchase of winning lottery tickets. This bill was inspired by <u>reporting from the Oregonian</u> last year.

At the hearing, Matt Shelby, Lottery's senior manager for communications and policy, gave background on the issue. The bill sponsors testified in support of the bill. The committee seemed supportive of the concept although some members raised concerns about enforcement. Ten people submitted written <u>comment</u> to oppose the bill. Another person testified to support of the bill but suggested the bill be amended to make Lottery winners anonymous, a concept that passed the House in 2019 (HB 3389) but did not pass the Senate.

Public Hearing on Bill to Require Problem Gambling Help Line on Billboards

<u>SB 914</u> would require Lottery to include the problem gambling helpline on billboard ads. This bill will have a public hearing today, February 20. You can watch the hearing <u>here</u>.

As a reminder, as an executive branch agency, Lottery is neutral on most legislation. We'll keep you posted on any developments.

Senate Confirms New Lottery Commissioner

On February 18, the Senate confirmed Jennifer Geller to serve on the Oregon State Lottery Commission. Lottery extends a warm welcome to our newest commissioner and we look forward to working with her.

Bills of Interest to the Lottery

Lawmakers <u>reportedly</u> broke records this session by introducing more than 2,800 bills in the first month of session. Lottery has reviewed the bills and is tracking those that would impact the Lottery.

In addition to <u>HB 3115</u> and <u>SB 914</u> discussed above, Lottery tracks bills relating to Lottery revenue and bills that apply to Lottery as a state agency or employer, as well as other miscellaneous bills of interest.
