#### 2025 Legislative Session – April Update

This memo provides an update on legislative activities relating to the Lottery.

# Public Hearing on HB 3115 A in the Senate

After passing the House last month, <u>HB 3115 A</u> appears headed for passage in the Senate. On April 17, a committee voted to move the bill forward to a full vote of the Senate. As a reminder, this bill would: prohibit the purchase or sale of winning Lottery tickets; prohibit the deduction of the price paid for a winning lottery ticket as a deduction on Oregon state income taxes; and prohibit the disclosure of a Lottery prize winner's name and address. We'll keep you updated.

## **Lottery Presentation to Ways & Means**

On March 26, Lottery Controller Karl Strauss <u>presented</u> an overview of Lottery's operations, game portfolio, and financial management to the General Government Subcommittee of Ways & Means. The committee was engaged and interested in learning about the Lottery. We provided <u>supplemental</u> material to the committee after the presentation.

## **New Lottery Beneficiary?**

The Legislature is considering how to fund future wildfire prevention and suppression efforts. One option under consideration is <u>SJR 11</u>, which would add wildfire prevention and mitigation as a constitutional beneficiary of lottery revenue. (As a reminder, our current constitutional beneficiaries are public education (18%), parks and natural resources (15%), and veterans' services (1.5%).)

SJR 11 would ask voters to approve a constitutional amendment on the November ballot. You can watch the public hearing on the bill <a href="here">here</a>. You can also see letters in support of the bill <a href="here">here</a>. We'll keep you updated if SJR 11 moves forward.

#### **Special Lottery Appropriations**

In each session in odd-numbered years, there are two omnibus Lottery bills, but those don't move forward until the final days of session in June. However, some standalone bills were passed over to Ways & Means that would fund specific programs or projects with lottery revenue or with proceeds from the sale of lottery-backed revenue bonds. Here's a sampling:

- County fairgrounds/horse racing (HB 2145; HB 2304; HB 3101)
- Levee improvements (HB 2693)
- Development of a unified trade strategy for Oregon (<u>HB 3100</u>)
- Construction of the James Beard Public Market (HB 3377)
- Oregon Coast Trail (<u>SB 929</u>)
- Support for small businesses in Portland's Albina neighborhood (<u>SB 1110</u>)

These bills now await further consideration from budget writers in Ways & Means.

## **Legislative Fiscal Office Report on Lottery Revenue**

In odd-numbered years, the Legislative Fiscal Office (LFO) is required to report on Lottery's administrative expenses and transfer rate. This year's report <u>is available here</u> and may be of interest. It gives an overview of Lottery revenues, administrative costs, transfer rate, and where the money goes.

#### All Eyes on May 15

To finish the legislative session, legislators need to hear the latest economic and revenue forecast from state economists. That is scheduled to be presented on Wednesday, May 15. Once the forecast is presented, legislators can make final discussions on the budget and move toward adjournment in June.

## Bills of Interest to the Lottery

As we approach the end of the legislative session, we've passed important bill deadlines. Bills that have not passed out of committee by April 9 (with some exceptions) cannot move forward. This means the list of bills Lottery is tracking is getting shorter! The latest list is attached for your reference.
